

BELIZE: DIVE INTO A WEALTH OF BIODIVERSITY



The Belize Barrier Reef, the largest reef system in the Northern Hemisphere, reveals hundreds of species of fish, marvelous sea turtles, graceful rays, gentle manatees, and over 90 varieties of coral. As only a small percentage of the reef has been

studied, researchers believe hundreds, even thousands, more species could be discovered in this protected zone. Much of Belize remains genuine wilderness, with large expanses of dense tropical forest, miles of wild rivers, and abundant bird life. Protecting 7,000 acres with three waterfalls, miles of hiking trails along creeks cutting through the tropical forest, Mayflower-Bocawina National Park is a gem in Belize's corridor of protected areas. Hike a nature trail with naturalists, photograph colorful tropical plants, search for exotic birds, and look out for the tracks of deer, tapirs, and wild cats. And learn of the extensive research on Central America's apex predator, the jaguar.


A NATURAL SUCCESS STORY



In 1996, the Belize Barrier Reef was designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site. In 2009, it was added to the List of World Heritage Sites in Danger due to the detection of coral bleaching, mangrove cutting, and excessive development. But in 2019, the Belize Barrier Reef was removed from this list as UNESCO determined it no longer faced threats from development. In recent years,

the Belize government placed a moratorium on oil exploration around the reef and added protections for coastal mangrove forests. Our expeditions put you at the heart of it—to experience the reef in all its natural splendor.



National Geographic Quest gives you rare access to the turquoise lagoons and white-sand beaches of the Mesoamerican Reef. She is equipped with a fleet of onboard tools—snorkel gear for every guest, Zodiacs, kayaks, standup paddleboards—so you can experience this vibrant habitat up close and





opportunities to explore by snorkel, kayak, and stand-up paddleboard. For scuba divers, there are incredible dive opportunities (additional cost). (B,L,D)

DAY 5: BELIZE BARRIER REEF


Our second straight day on the reef brings us into the central cayes where we anchor close and go snorkeling, paddleboarding, diving, or kayaking inside the fringing reef. Coral patches dot the shallow lagoon, harboring parrotfish, butterflyfish, octopus, and other marine species. (B,L,D)

DAY 6: BELIZE CITY/DISEMBARK

Return to Belize City overnight and disembark after

breakfast to transfer to the international airport for your flight home. Or continue on our land excursion to Tikal and Yaxhá. (B)

BELIZE TO TIKAL: REEFS, RIVERS & RUINS OF THE MAYA WORLD

The expedition continues inside the Maya Biosphere Reserve—which is twice the size of Yellowstone National Park. BELIZE TO TIKAL COSTS INCLUDE: All inclusions for Belize portion as noted above; three hotel nights in Tikal; meals on land as indicated with non-alcoholic beverages; gratuities to local guides in Tikal; ground transportation Belize City/El Remate/Flores.

NOT INCLUDED: International air transportation; meals not indicated; extensions; scuba diving fees; passport, visa, immigration fees; travel protection plan; items of a personal nature such as alcoholic beverages (on the Tikal portion) or certain super premium brands while onboard;, Wi-Fi, and laundry. Gratuities to ship's crew at your discretion.

AIRFARE: Airfare is an additional cost. Lindblad Expeditions will assist in making your air arrangements for a \$50 per person service fee.

RESERVATIONS: To confirm your place, an advance payment of 15% of the cabin fare per person is required at the time of reservation and is payable by check, Visa, MasterCard, American Express, or Discover. Receipt of advance payment indicates your acceptance of the terms and conditions.

FINAL PAYMENT: Payment is due 120 days prior to departure. Lindblad Expeditions reserves the right to cancel your reservation if payment has not been received by final payment due date.

TRAVEL PROTECTION PLAN: Because the cancellation policies outlined below are strictly enforced, we strongly recommend that you purchase trip cancellation insurance for your protection. Upon receiving your reservation, Bryn Mawr College will send you information on coverage options.
